King's, Misericordia, and Wilkes establish Language Institute

The press conference and reception were held at the Innovation Center@Wilkes-Barre.

At a press conference in the Innovation Center@Wilkes-Barre, King's College, College Misericordia, and Wilkes University announced the creation of The Language Institute, a collaborative effort designed to promote and enrich foreign language study on each campus and throughout the greater community.

Revitalizing the study of foreign languages will help the region compete in a global economy and improve the region's quality of life by facilitating the appreciation and understanding of foreign cultures. The creation of the Institute is a response to the critical need to meet the challenges and opportunities posed by

increasing globalization.

Through the shared resources and combined expertise of the three member colleges, The Language Institute will provide diverse opportunities for foreign language study that meet the needs of traditional students, adult learners, working professionals and the general community.

The announcement included remarks from college presidents Dr. Michael A. MacDowell of College Misericordia; Rev. Thomas J. O'Hara, C.S.C.; and Dr. Tim Gilmour of Wilkes University. The event concluded with a reception and question and answer session.

The Institute will support the develop-

ment and expansion of academic majors and undergraduate degree programs in Spanish and French as well as provide professional development opportunities through credit and non-credit continued learning courses for the community. The Institute will also preserve languages that have contributed to the culture and heritage of the region, such as Polish, Ukrainian, Lithuanian and Italian, as well as provide educational programs that support knowledge and understanding of other cultures.
