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King's pins hopes on 2005 Kids' Bowlathon

King's College will again support the local Big Brothers and Big Sisters program in this year's Bowlathon. Last year, the King's community provided more than 100 bowlers, forming 25 teams, to raise over \$2,100 to support Bowl for Kids' Sake.

This year, King's is accepting donations, seeking bowlers to take pledges, or student clubs or groups to sponsor lanes for the 2005 Bowl for Kids' Sake Bowlathon on Saturday, March 19, at Stanton Lanes in Wilkes-

Barre. King's raised more money for this event the past two years than any other area college, and hopes to continue this impressive tradition of caring this year.

Athletic Training Month is shaping up at King's

National Athletic Training Month promotes athletic training by making the community aware of the profession and its goals. The King's College Athletic Training Education Program is sponsoring a presentation on sinusitis; participating in "Shape Up PA"; and organizing a 5K running race/ 1-mile walk.

King's Sports Medicine department and Student Health Center will hold a talk on sinusitis by Jeanne Torony, MD, Student Health Center physician, on Wednesday, Feb. 23, at 6 p.m. in the Burke Auditorium. Sinusitis, or inflammation of the sinuses, affects 37 million Americans each year. In her presentation, Dr. Torony will discuss the causes of sinusitis, signs and symptoms of sinusitis, how it is diagnosed and treated, and how it can be prevented.

As part of Shape Up PA, King's Gold Medal Team, the "Sports Med Phatties" is working to retain its gold medal in 2005 by developing healthy habits, achieving weight loss and increasing activity levels. Shape Up PA runs through June 29.


