## Visiting poet Jim Daniels writes of work and faith

Poet and writer Jim Daniels will read from his work on Mon., Oct. 25, at King's College. Currently Director of the Creative Writing Program at Carnegie-Mellon University, Pittsburgh, Daniels is a guest of the 2004 Visiting Writer Program of the King's College English Department.

He is the author of eight books of poetry including *Show and Tell: New and Selected Poems*, a collection of short stories titled *Detroit Tales*, and several screenplays. Winner of the prestigious Pushcart Prize and a contributor to Best American Poetry 2000, Daniels writes of blue collar jobs, the dignity of work, the violence of cities, the challenges to faith.

Daniels's reading in the Burke Auditorium is on Mon., Oct. 25, at 8 p.m. Daniels will be available to autograph his books.

McCauley possesses a strong background in fiscal management having served as manager, controller and vice president for 10 years within the banking and financial industry. For the past decade she has been CFO for higher educational institutions, most recently with Northampton Community College in Bethlehem, Pa., which has an enrollment of 30,000 full- and part-time students. At Northampton, she was vice president of finance and operations.

McCauley first came to King's as an undergraduate and received her degree in 1982 with a double major in accounting and theology. McCauley also holds an MBA degree from the University of Scranton and her doctoral degree in education from Widener University, Chester, Pa.

In her roles as vice president for business affairs and chief financial officer, she is responsible for maintaining smooth financial and business operations at King's and for overseeing the institution's fiscal strength.

## Expanding King's global Holy Cross connections

Rev. Thomas O' Hara, C.S.C., has formed a Working Group on Global Holy Cross Connections to clarify and embody the Catholic identity and mission of King's College. This group will explore ways in which King's can create mutually beneficial interactions with those who share our common Holy Cross ties.

While King's has made strides in recent years to share the Holy Cross tradition with our students and new faculty and staff, these efforts have largely focused on the Holy Cross presence in the United States, beginning with the founding of the University of Notre Dame. But there is a much larger Holy Cross community that stretches across continents. King's can gain much by reaching out to our sisters and brothers in those places.

Some of the Holy Cross links from which King's has already benefited include — the annual visit of St. Bernadine's Choir; SERVE trips to Monterey, Mexico, and Phoenix, Ariz.; Holy Cross

ministries in Canto Grande, Peru; and the presence of Holy Cross community members from Peru and Uganda on our campus. The Working Group recognizes that these efforts may be just the beginnings of a larger review of our globalization endeavors on campus and beyond.

As its inaugural public event, the Working Group on Global Holy Cross Connections will sponsor a presentation by Rev. Thomas McDermott, C.S.C., on Holy Cross values and the call of the poor on Thursday, Nov. 11 at 3:30 in the Burke Auditorium.
