King's shines light on plight of the homeless and hungry

To call attention to the plight of the homeless, the hungry, the afflicted, and those seeking social justice in the world, King's again presented a series of annual on-campus programs in "Hunger for Justice Week," a nationwide project across college campuses.

For the 60-Hour **Homeless Experience in the College park**, students, faculty, and staff got a taste of the challenges of survival that the homeless face each day. The event raised \$451 to buy gloves, hats, and scarfs for the homeless.

For **The Oxfam Fast** in the College dining hall, 254 students chose to give up their meals so that others might eat. The dinners given up by students with a College meal plan resulted in \$1,270 which was donated to the St. Vincent dePaul Kitchen.

Caring Cases represented the efforts of the King's community to fight hunger. The various departments and offices of King's donated \$988.32 to purchase 40 cases of assorted canned goods that were given to REACH, an emergency food program.

Dr. Morris makes 'excellent' sense of life and work

Professor Tom Morris, who has been called "America's leading public philosopher," instructs people to become more philosophical about their lives, and wiser in their choices. As this year's Ethics Center lecturer at King's, Professor Morris will present two lectures on Monday, Nov. 22.

At 3:30 p.m. he will discuss, "True Success: A New Philosophy of Excellence." In his lecture at 7 p.m., Morris focuses on "If Aristotle Ran General Motors: The New Soul of Business." Both addresses are co-sponsored by King's College Center for Ethics and Public Life and the Family Business Forum.

Tom Morris is author of more than 15 books and is currently chairman of the Morris Institute for Human Values in Wilmington, N.C. With the publication of his twelfth book, *True Success: A New Philosophy of Excellence* in 1994, he became a public philosopher and advisor to the corporate world.

He has addressed corporate audiences at Coca Cola, Motorola, Merrill Lynch, IBM, Price Waterhouse, and Northwest-ern Mutual Life.

Morris holds degrees in philosophy and religious studies from Yale University. He taught philosophy of religion at the University of Notre Dame for 15 years.

Both lectures are in the Burke Auditorium.

Friend, cinematographer to Orson Welles to speak Dec. 4

Hollywood cinematographer Gary Graver was a friend and associate of American film giant Orson Welles. Welles's influence on Hollywood and filmmaking across the globe, his roller coaster career, and his impressive contributions to the worlds of acting, screenwriting and directing are unequalled. On Dec. 4, at 2 p.m. in the Burke Auditorium, Graver will share his insights and remembrances of the life and genius of Orson Welles.

Graver and Welles worked together on more than a dozen projects over 15 years until Welles's death in 1985. Graver will be accompanied by his wife, actress Jillian Kesner. The couple is dedicated to propagating the memory of the man many consider the most talented and innovative filmmaker of all time. They travel the world with their documentary, working with Orson Welles, and are co-curators of the Orson Welles Film Archives in Los Angeles.

One of the most sought-after cinematographers in Hollywood, Gary Graver's has over 150 film credits. Besides Welles, he has worked with such directors as Ron Howard and Steven Spielberg. Jillian Kesner appeared in feature films and in television series such as *Mork and Mindy*, *Happy Days* and *Three's Company*.

The Gravers' visit is sponsored by the Honors Program at King's which offered *The Films of Orson Welles*, taught by Dr. Charles S. Kraszewski.
