



Rev. Ryan Named Interim Director of McGowan School

Dr. David Martin, Director of McGowan School of Business, who was instrumental in bringing the highly regarded AACSB International - The American Association of Collegiate Schools of Business - accreditation to the business school, announced his resignation effective on May 31, 2004. Dr. Martin, who has accepted another position, will be sorely missed.

In announcing Dr. Martin's departure, Rev. Donald Grimes, C.S.C., Vice President for Academic Affairs and Dean of the Faculty, wrote "Father O'Hara and I extend our deep appreciation to Dr. Martin for his energetic and effective leadership during these several years, and for the achievement he shares with so many in bringing the Business School to the goal of AACSB accreditation. He deserves our sincere gratitude and respect for accepting and meeting that challenge."

Rev. John J. Ryan, C.S.C., Ph.D., Associate Professor of Business Administration, has been appointed Interim Director of the William G. McGowan School of Business, for a two-year period effective June 1.



Rev. Grimes, said regarding the appointment, "Father Ryan has earned the respect and admiration of his colleagues and students. His intellectual rigor, his engaging and effective teaching and mentoring of students, and his leadership are well known. Thirteen years of experience in the business world prior to his entry into the Congregation of Holy Cross and ordination to the priesthood allow Father Ryan to bring 'real world' grounding to his teaching and scholarship ...Beginning immediately, Dr. Martin and Father Ryan will work closely to assure that the transition in leadership is smooth and coherent."
